Student group achievement is monitored annually through the Closing the Gaps domain of the State accountability. Any campus that has one or more achievement gap(s) between individual student groups and the interim goals for three consecutive years will be identified as a consistently underperforming school.

(dd) the methodology by which the State identifies a school for comprehensive support and improvement as required under subsection (c)(4)(D)(i); The Closing the Gaps domain scaled score is used to identify schools for comprehensive support and improvement.
